ASCENSION GARDEN CEMETERY MOMENTS FROM MENDON PONDS PARK

Many people from the Rochester and surrounding areas are very familiar with Holy Sepulchre Cemetery and all that it has to offer. What some may not know is that in 2010, we built our newest cemetery, Ascension Garden. This cemetery is located on the east side of Rochester at 1900 Pinnacle Road in Henrietta New York. Ascension Garden was born out of the history and excellence of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery and the original vision of Bishop McQuaid.

Ascension Garden Mausoleum features a wide range of crypt options in rooms devoted to various Saints, as well as crypts located in the Mausoleum Chapel. Our niche rooms, also devoted to Saints, offer beautiful glass and marble front niche options. Our mausoleum is climate-controlled to allow for comfortable visitation of your loved ones. Our Chapel within the mausoleum gives families the option to hold a memorial service and also serves as a quiet space for personal meditation.

Our **Cremation Gardens** overlook the Ascension Garden Chapel and our beautifully landscaped cemetery grounds. The cremation gardens are centrally located, therefore offering sweeping views of the cemetery. Within these gardens we have several Columbaria, which offer an option for above ground, exterior cremation. We have both wall units and octagonal units in both cremation garden sections of our cemetery.



ASCENSION GARDEN MAUSOLEUM

Our **Garden Sections** are beautifully landscaped with flowering trees and ornamental plantings. Families may choose from sections that offer flat, slant or upright monuments to meet their personal preference for memorialization.

For those seeking an eco-friendly burial, our St. Francis Meadow offers **Green Burial** options on wooded trails and in a natural meadow. There are options for both cremation and full body burials. Within this section is the St. Francis Butterfly Garden, a separate garden option for cremation,



RICH HISTORY

Memorial Day is a time to remember the men and women who died while in the military service of our country, particularly those who died in battle or as a result of wounds sustained in battle; to memorialize the veterans who made ultimate sacrifice for our country. One such hero is memorialized right here at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Colonel Patrick Henry O'Rorke was the commanding officer of the 140th New York Infantry Regiment during the American Civil War. Just like his regiment, O'Rorke was raised in Rochester though he was born in County Cavan, Ireland. He graduated first in his class at West Point Military Academy in 1861. Originally Patrick served as an officer in the Army Corps of Engineers, but accepted the commission of Colonel of the 140th NY in September of 1862. O'Rorke is best remembered for leading his men in a heroic charge over Little Round Top at the Battle of Gettysburg on July 2, 1863. This action would prove to be his last, as he urged his men forward to support the wavering 16th Michigan Infantry, Col. O'Rorke was then shot and killed. A monument

to his heroics and to the 140th NY can be found at Gettysburg on the site of where he fell. O'Rorke was buried on the battlefield after his death, and his body was then moved to a hill closer to his family. His grave was later moved to the foot of the hill due to his mother's difficulty to ascend said hill. Later, the remains were moved to Holy Sepulchre in 1887, where they still reside today.

John served the Rochester community as a firefighter for nearly 27 years, beginning in 1985. He was appointed to Fire Chief in 2007 and served until 2012, acted as the Mid-Atlantic Director

for the National Fire Protection Association from 2012 to 2017 and most recently, as the Fire Chief in Fort Myers, Florida, beginning 2017. Caufield has leadership experience with a career focused on service. Terrence C. Finegan, Executive Vice Chairperson of the Board, expressed confidence in the hiring committee's choice. "John D. Caufield has established a career managing two municipal fire departments. 
